

Learning from Adverse Maternal Events in Maryland

This one-hour, CME/CEU-approved training was co-developed with Dr. William Callaghan, a national expert in maternal health and former chief of the CDC's Maternal and Infant Health Branch, and Dr. Shari Lawson, Director of General Obstetrics and Gynecology at Johns Hopkins Hospital and health disparities researcher. The training provides an overview of national and state trends and presents deidentified cases of maternal mortality and severe maternal morbidity from Maryland.

The training has two parts:

- Part One provides an overview of trends in maternal mortality and severe maternal morbidity in Maryland and nationally.
- Part Two presents deidentified cases of maternal mortality and severe maternal morbidity from Maryland.

By the end of the training, you will be able to:

- Discuss trends in maternal mortality and severe maternal morbidity in Maryland and the United States.
- Recognize the value of hospital, state and national maternal morbidity and severe maternal mortality reviews for improving the quality of maternity care.
- Identify key practices in recognition and management strategies for patients with prevalent pregnancy and postpartum complications.
