Identification of key priorities, goals, and desired outcomes


Public input through stakeholder meetings

- Take a strength-based approach
- Center communities
- Data driven and evidence-informed

Maternal Health Strategic Plan: Outcomes

Over the next five years (2021-2026):

Primary Outcomes:

- Decrease Maternal Mortality
 - Decrease black-white disparities in maternal mortality
- Decrease Severe Maternal Morbidity

Additional Outcomes:

- Decrease the percentage of women who smoke while pregnant and reduce disparities attributable to race or ethnicity (Title V)
- Increase the percentage of pregnant women who have a dental visit during pregnancy and reduce disparities attributable to race or ethnicity (Title V)

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- Increase risk appropriate perinatal Care (Title V)
- Address and treat Substance Use Disorder in pregnant and post partum women

1. Promote equity and mobilize against racism

Strategies:

- Collect and report data related to race/ethnicity and use data to inform action
- Provide trainings to expand employees' understanding of the impacts of racism
- Include and engage impacted communities in decision making or advisory roles



2. Empower and support Maryland moms through advocacy for and implementation of policies

Strategies:

- Examine the role of Maryland Prenatal Risk Assessments (MPRAs) and the Postpartum Infant Maternal Referral (PIMR) Form in addressing risks
- Support efforts for CHW training and certification as well doula training and certification in Maryland
- Promote initiatives that mandate screening and evidence-based treatment protocols for perinatal mood and anxiety disorders and substance use disorders
- Advocate for diverse membership of the Maternal Mortality Review Committee



3. Strengthen families and communities

Strategies:

- Improve family and community driven service provision
- Support coordination and cooperation to promote reproductive and sexual health within communities
- Support capacity building in areas of concentrated disadvantage
- Improve environments to support healthy living



4. Enhance maternal health surveillance, monitoring and evaluation

Strategies:

- Develop a severe maternal morbidity review process to prevent future cases of morbidity and mortality
- Identify and link those who are pregnant and with COVID-19
- Have data be more accessible to Maryland families and providers

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5. Transform systems and service delivery for Maryland mothers

Strategies:

- Provide trainings to expand employees' understanding of the impacts of racism (same as above)
- Increase availability of specialty care providers such as Maternal Fetal medicine, ultrasound screenings, postpartum follow-ups available.
- Expand provider use of guidance for clinical management of chronic diseases and other risk factors or events, such as obesity, hypertension, and hemorrhage during pregnancy and delivery


